Guess what? We did it! We made it through the darkest 10 weeks of the year! Mid-November to mid-January are the times when we have the least amount of daylight in the year. The Northern hemisphere is getting brighter one day at a time. As I am writing this, it is 40 degrees outside. It's still overcast and a little gray, but I see the light peeking through. 



**2026 Mountain Sky
Five-Day Academy
for Spiritual Formation**
Monday, May 18, 2026
to Saturday, May 23, 2026
Rocky Mountain College - Billings, MT

Theme:

“Beholding God In the Landscape of Our Lives”

We find ourselves in the landscapes of our lives, longing for a closer connection to God. During this Academy, we seek to behold God through a rhythm of silence, community, learning, worship and fun. All are invited to this contemplative and transformational journey.

Beautiful Rocky Mountain College will serve as the setting for this Academy. As part of the Academy model, each participant will have an individual dorm room with a private bathroom. The Five-Day Academy begins on Monday afternoon, May 18th and ends on Saturday, May 23rd at noon. On the evening of the first day, there is a group dinner, a welcome and orientation, covenant group introduction, and a Eucharist celebration. Each day following includes curriculum sessions, times of silent reflection, discussions with the faculty, and Covenant Group meetings. There is also a nightly Eucharist Service, Morning Prayer and Night Prayer

Registration rate is \$890. Refunds (minus a \$50 cancellation fee) will be considered until April 10, 2026.
